Experts talk ways of staying 'future ready'

Chandigarh: In a wide ranging discussion and active interaction the implications of a rapidly changing world on education were analysed by a panel of experts at the NIE's annual principals' seminar in Chandigarh on Wednesday.

The topic 'Be future ready Careers and teaching in the 21st Century', which gave the academicians an insight into the enormity of the change engulfing our schools and the impact of this change on the learning process, was discussed by panelists including Usha Albuquerque, who has been in the field of career guidance for last 19 years, Aneet Goel, who runs International School of Animation, an institution that is poised to set a benchmark in the field of animation stud-

ies, and Anustup Nayak, a partner at iDiscoveri Education.

Apart from voicing the views and ideas of principals, the seminar provided an opportunity for the audience to interact with eminent personalities on the panel.
